LET'S CONSIDER THESE EIGHT AREAS OF INTELLIGENCE THAT WE CAN RECOGNIZE IN YOUNG PEOPLE



- * <u>Musical Intelligence</u> is the ability to produce and respond to music.
- * <u>Bodily-kinesthetic Intelligence</u> is the ability to use one's body to solve problems.
- * <u>Logical-mathematical Intelligence</u> is the ability to understand the basic properties of numbers and the principles of cause and effect.
- * <u>Linguistic Intelligence</u> is the ability to use language to express ideas and learn new words or other languages.
- * <u>Spatial Intelligence</u> the ability to form a mental image of spatial layouts.
- * <u>Interpersonal Intelligence</u> is the ability to understand other people and work with them.
- * <u>Intrapersonal Intelligence</u> is the ability to understand things about oneself.
- * <u>Naturalist Intelligence</u> is the ability to recognize plants and animals in the environment.

Most teachers and caregivers understand the idea that in any group of children there is a rainbow of differences. Keeping in mind this 'rainbow' idea, helps them to provide a variety of educational activities and experiences to assist all of their children to grow to their full potential.
